This comes after Blagojevich closed several parks and historic sites to save the state money. Blagojevich cut state funding for the David Davis Mansion in Bloomington, Bishop Hill, Moraine View and Jubilee College State Parks locally. During Quinn's stop in Peoria Saturday, he says he's already been an avid supporter of protecting those state sites. Governor Pat Quinn said, "I really believe in conservation and the Department of Natural Resources. It's been decimated over the last 6 years and I have protested. Anybody who would like to go on line, Save Our State Parks.org, we are going to re-open our parks." Quinn also says he will closely review the former governor's plan to close Pontiac Prison. He has already spoken to Prison union members in Springfield regarding the issue. Quinn is also making a new pitch for Capital construction plan to put people to work. The Governor said, "If you're able bodied and breathing, we want you working. That's the goal of Illinois. The number one Civil Right right now is the right to a job." Quinn wants to have a construction plan in place by April 3rd.
